	BACKGROUND: The TRCC Coordinator will provide a brief update on progress on local agency projects.	
	Danielle King reported that the Marion County Clerk's Office will not be using grant funding, since they decided to move forward with a different case maintenance system. They asked if they could use grant funds to offset the overall cost of the new system since it includes an ecitation module. Danielle informed them that funding could only be used for the portion of the system related to traffic records.	
	The E-Citation Expansion project was given approval to move forward if the University of Florida wants to proceed given the 6 month schedule. Ilir Bejleri indicated they are committed to doing the project, but they would have to compress the schedule and either reduce the amount of work or increase the amount of labor on the project.	
	Maureen Johnson requested a list of the law enforcement agencies that are receiving Section 405 grant funding, since DHSMV provides similar grant funding to agencies for motor carrier data improvements.	
	Danielle reported that she has received questions from law enforcement agencies regarding eligibility for Section 405 funding if the agency is also receiving funding from DHSMV. Cambridge Systematics is developing a list of frequently asked questions to include on the TRCC website.

	Crash, Driver, Citation/Adjudication Data Systems:	
	Deborah Todd, DHSMV, reported that SaDIP has received 33 applications from law enforcement agencies to purchase hardware to support electronic commercial vehicle crash reporting. They are approving 18 applications that meet the criteria for the grant. They are also conducting 5 training sessions this year.	
	Mark Welch, FHP, noted that the electronic crash reporting system will not accept 'unknown' as a vehicle type. Hit and run crashes aren't showing up because they can't select it as a commercial vehicle related crash. Maureen stated that Tom Austin is working with David Hestle on data checks, and she suggested that her and Mark talk offline.	
	DHSMV will be conducting 14 workshops with clerk courts to provide training on TCATS & data resolution. They are also conducting Train the Trainer sessions with liaisons who will contact local clerks and work with them on special issues. DHSMV will be providing training materials for them to pass out.	
	APRISS reported that they are now on-site at DHSMV and are working to close out the crash database. The contract with University of Florida has been amended to allow UF to send APRISS the crash geolocation codes. The long term goal is for the FIRES portal to be the location for storing crash statistical data. Danielle inquired about the ability for FIRES to do adhoc reporting. The FIRES portal can be used for ad hoc reporting upon request, and users also have the capability to query data.	
	DHSMV will send Danielle the list of 18 agencies receiving grant funding.	
	Roadway	
	Benjamin Jacobs reported that FDOT is considering changes to the Roadway Characteristics Inventory, but they are still looking into the issues. For crash data, they currently have a project to update the database structure to accept the new format. They will be testing it in 2 to 3 weeks and then move into production. They expect it to be in place by the end of the fiscal year.	
	An attendee inquired whether the database will accept short forms. Theoretically it could, but the capability won't be in place until next year after an assessment of the required work load has been completed.	
	EMS/Trauma	
	Brenda Clotfelter reported that DOH is working to create mandatory reporting requirements for	



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	EMS data. Current submittals are on a voluntary basis only. There will be two workshops on mandatory participation, and then they hope to move forward with the rule making. They hope to have the rule to require mandatory EMS reporting finalized by the end of summer.	
	Steve McCoy reported that the Trauma Registry has been up and runn. The registry is nationally compliant. They are conducting workshops to submit trauma data.

	There are two parts to the project: 1) geolocation, and 2) working with DHSMV to improve data quality. Part 2 will be conducted in the last part of the fiscal year because of the amount of coordination involved. For Part 1, they are working with TRACS staff and went live with 3 TRACS agencies (Panama City, Central Florida, and Palm Bay). These three agencies have mandatory use of TRACS. They have been able to geolocate 208 crash reports, and they hope to achieve 1,000+ by May. They want to create a training webinar to post online, and they will be working in collaboration with TRACS. CTS America (FHP vendor) will start implementation in June, and they also started discussions with iyeTek. They will then reach out to the remaining vendors.

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	Field Data Collection for NEMSIS Compliance (Brenda Clotfelter)  Brenda reported on current progress in performance measurement. 57% of agencies (155 agencies) are reporting electronically, which accounts for 76% of runs (10 million). Timeliness of runs has increased substantially, with 16% submitted within 10 days (up 3.5% from 2012) and 58% submitted within 30 days (up 13.5% from 2012). Florida is still ranked #1 in national compliance. They will transition agencies currently reporting to EMSTARS in April. Other agencies ready to transition will be done in July. The vendor has become NEMSIS certified, which is critical for the transition to the new state system. The NEMSIS revised timeline has been extended to December 2015 (previously December 2014), which will give local agencies more time for the transition.  Crash Records Data Improvement Plan (Maureen Johnson)  The objective of the project is to establish a baseline for crash report long form accuracy and completeness, and to increase performance in these areas by 5% per year. For the 2011 crash report long form, the baselines for accuracy and completeness are 73.24% and 44.32%, respectively. Cross-edit check criteria were presented for each performance area. For the 2013 crash report long form, accuracy increased to 88.5% and completeness increased to 56.54%. They are adding e-crash agencies, and a new vendor, Southern Software, was approved for electronic submission. Five law enforcement agencies were transitioned to electronic submissions, which was a 2.5% gain for the quarter in the number of LEAs electronically submitting crash reports. From July 1 – Sept. 30, 2013, 69.32% of crash reports were electronic. This past quarter, Oct. 1 – Dec. 31, 75.66% of crash reports were electronic.

	Danielle King reported that Florida received \$2.9M in traffic records funding in FY14 under MAP-21. The TRCC awarded \$1.6M in grant funding in Round 1, and \$700k in Round 2. We anticipate receiving \$1.6 to \$2M in funding for FY15.  The TRCC was asked to consider how they wanted to change the grant application process in the future. Danielle discussed some of the changes to the grant announcement and application forms for FY15. We received several incomplete applications, so we changed the announcement to state that proposals from LEAs will be disqualified if they don't submit the supplemental application form. Some agencies were confused by the application form requiring details for	



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	multiple year budget projects, and inquired if that meant that the agency was approved for multiple years of funding. The application form was modified to include whether the agency plans to apply for single or multiple years, and the detailed budget for years 2 and 3 was removed.
