Ms. King also discussed that there is no change in the currently available funds for FY 17 TRCC grants so the five concept papers approved at the May meeting were all that would be approved at this time. Timeliness is based on reports being submitted into the database within 10 days of the crash. They have conducted five classes this year, training 216 people. 11 trainings are scheduled to occur this year in an attempt to train over 600 people. (electronic status, errors receiving, same questions posed at the workshops). Agency goal was met to contact clerks. Provided a web-based registration for four workshops. Creating report to improve the top 25% errors. Results from the workshop, LEA says the state is not telling the vendors what to do, Clerks are not talking to each other. Vendor Reports availability. Waiting on final report. DHSMV will reach out to citation vendors, Clerk and LEA to review upfront validation rules. UTC process improvement group meets bi-weekly and will discuss concerns and address them. Timeliness of citation data is being reviewed from DHSMV to review information that will affect drivers.
